Debora Cossée has spent more than 20 years in the not-for-profit sector, as a manager and finance coordinator specializing in the housing sector as well as environmental and retirement industries. She is currently Financial Officer for Music for Young Children. Debra managed to make a very dry and somewhat intimidating subject have a little humour and augmented everyone's knowledge and comfort levels, showing us how to keep more money in our pockets while benefiting from being self-employed.



Two Weekends of Adult Music Students' Events March 7: Workshop & Piano Master Class

I really enjoyed organizing the Adult Students' Workshop & Piano Master Class on March 7. Adult students are so appreciative, courageous and eager to learn! Although it takes courage to perform in front of peers, the students were grateful for the opportunity to perform and share their music.



Dina Namer was the clinician for the all-day event. In attendance were a number of observers, six Master Class participants and three students who received a performance evaluation from Dina.

Dina's Workshop topic was "Overcoming Performance Obstacles." Some steps that lead to a successful performance are:

- * Choose repertoire to match your capacity, but at the same time, try new styles;
- * Practice with awareness. Adults with busy schedules need to put their "to-do" list and worries aside in order to be more aware during practice:
- * Decide on the fingering. Confidence in fingering is key to security on the stage;
- * Practice the music slowly to be more aware of all the elements in the music.

Dina shared helpful and humorous advice including the notion of eating a banana half-hour before the performance to calm those nerves!!! The adult students gained practical and valuable coping strategies and technique tips from Dina's comments and suggestions. Master Class and Performance Evaluation participants benefited from Dina's thoughtful suggestions. All who attended were most appreciative of Dina's willingness to share with us her vast musical knowledge.





March 14: Workshop & Vocal Master Class by Carol A. Wood, Convener

Susan Blyth Schofield, Carleton University Associate Performance Instructor and Sessional Lecturer, presented a Workshop on "Performance Jitters" and Christiane Riel, Head of the Vocal Sector, University of Ottawa, led a Vocal Master Class. The event was attended by an audience of 10 including 4 Master Class singers who represented 2 ORMTA teachers.

In the morning Workshop, Susan provided hand-outs in which each participant filled out a self evaluation on causes of their nervousness. A number of breathing exercises were presented and practiced to help the calming process. Character and repertoire research were discussed as a vehicle for relieving stress. And finally a list of strategies were suggested to prevent hijacking our own performances.

Following a brown bag lunch, a Vocal Master Class was given by Christiane who worked in depth with the singers. Christiane offered helpful tips on achieving a supported and resonant sound while clarifying the diction in the Italian, French and English repertoire presented. Gloria Jean Nagy and Ioulia Brechun provided piano accompaniment.

Brava to Susan and Christiane for sharing their ideas with us. We are grateful for the contributions to the Saturday event. Thank you.

Helen Sinclair, Recipient of the 2015 ORMTA Contribution to Teaching Award by Carol A. Wood

Helen Sinclair was born in Guelph, Ontario and grew up in nearby Acton. Her father was a church organist and an accomplished cornet player. As the oldest daughter in the family, Helen, at age 12, gained valuable experience accompanying her father for his cornet solos.

During her high school years, Helen studied piano with Dorothy Richardson Scull, who encouraged her to begin teaching junior piano students. Singing was also a part of her early music education. She sang alto in church choirs, the high school Glee Club, the Teachers' College Choir and participated in small ensemble groups.

Helen graduated from Lakeshore Teachers' College and enjoyed a brief career as a primary school teacher in Acton. She married Mac Sinclair in 1963 and they lived in Toronto, Kingston, and Sunnyvale, California. In 1971, they set-



tled in Ottawa with their two young children. In 1973, Helen accepted a position as church organist, resumed piano studies with Irene Woodburn Wright and began building her private piano studio. She went on to receive her Associate Diplomas for Performance and Teaching from the Western Ontario Conservatory of Music. A desire to continue studies and to expand her musical knowledge led Helen to Carleton University where she took courses and studied with pianist Verna Jacobson, graduating in 1993 with a Bachelor of Music.

Helen played an important role in the rejuvenation of the Laurentian Junior Music Club, serving as President for 9 years. Other community work includes volunteering and sharing her talents at a local seniors' care facility since the early 1970's. She presently accompanies a community women's choir whose purpose is to bring entertainment to seniors' residences and provide an artistic outlet for older singers.

Encouraged by Irene Woodburn Wright, Helen joined ORMTA in the early 1980's and has held various portfolios: Social Convener, First Class Honours Recital, Canada Music Week, New Members and presently Cards and Flowers. She is always willing to volunteer at ORMTA events.

Helen is grateful to the Ottawa Region Branch of ORMTA for the recognition and honour of being chosen for this award. She appreciates and values the many friendships that she has made, the opportunities available for personal enrichment and professional growth and for all the support and performing platforms that we make available for students on all levels.

With a piano teaching career which has spanned some 45 years, Helen has been thankful for the wonderful people that have been part of her studio. She encourages young students to develop their abilities so that the joy of music will be a lifelong source of pleasure to them.

She is a member of the College of Examiners for the Royal Conservatory of Music and adjudicates singing, piano and theory.

As a collaborative pianist, she has most recently taken part in several productions for both Spring-Works & Hermione Presents such as *Festival Gems I & II*, *Forties Follies* and *Three Little Maids* in Stratford.ON.

Carol is a member of the Kitchener-Waterloo branch of ORMTA and a member of NATS.

His passion for chamber music allowed him to perform with renowned musicians such as Eric Ruske, Emilio Còlon, Kenneth Grant, Marco Zoni, Massimiliano Motterle, Jethro Marks, Winona Zelenka, Paul Marleyn, David Gardner, Yusuke Hayashi, Benjamin Bowman, Wolfgang David, Netanel Draiblate, Lucia Luque, Liv Hilde Klokk, Steeve Michaud, Julie Nesrallah...

Mauro performed the complete Violin and Piano as well as the complete Cello and Piano sonatas by Beethoven in a two consecutive days project that received acclamation by the audience and the critic. Review of La Bohème with the Ontario Opera Collaborative




